**SICK AND HOMEBOUND:** Please notify the Rectory if anyone in your home is seriously sick or homebound.

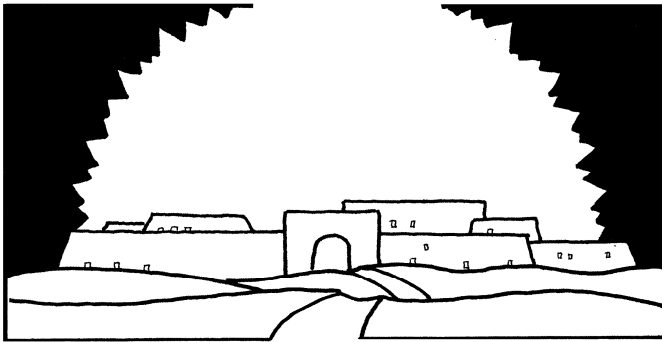
**PARISH REGISTRATION:** All families or individuals who have moved into the parish should register by filling out the registration card available at the church doors.

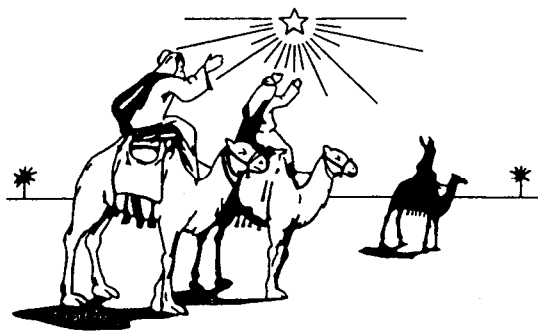

## A TALE FOR OUR TIME

*The story of the magi is especially meaningful in our day. While our own country is becoming more multicultural and multireligious, the importance of the message of today's celebration becomes more urgent: God's son Jesus was sent by God to bring all peoples together. The Epiphany speaks of God's desire that all live in peace as God's children.*

## INSIDE THE READINGS

The word "epiphany" itself means "to appear" and is often used in reference to the appearance of God. The Church celebrates on this day both the coming of God in Christ and the coming of God in Christ into the lives of Christians.

Today we reflect on the first reading, which speaks about the effects of God's coming into our own lives. This reading is from a section of the book of Isaiah that scholars call Third Isaiah, which was written when the Jewish people returned from exile in Babylon in the sixth century B.C. Life back home was very difficult, and the prophet writes to give them hope about what God can and will do for them.

Isaiah speaks in poetry, with radical images to counter the spiritual shortsightedness caused by the people's disappointments. These images will provide them with a new perspective that opens their spirits to be able to receive confidently what God's coming means for them. So he appeals to their imaginations to suggest the richness of God for them. It is like light in the midst of darkness (Isaiah 66:1-2). This light will enlighten them regarding how to live. Isaiah says that the people themselves will become this light so that others will use them as examples of how to live (60:3). God comes for the transformation of people, and transformation spreads as more and more see what enlightened living looks like.

Finally, Isaiah writes about God's presence to them in terms resonant with the deepest desires of our hearts: God's coming will create family togetherness and family blessings.

In the light of God's epiphany in Jesus Christ we realize that these blessings are fully realized in the next life. The Isaiah reading informs us, however, of how God is already at work in some ways even now to achieve these ends.

## THOUGHTS FOR ACTION

We can pray that the divisions and hatreds that continue to plague our planet will be resolved through the wisdom that is the gift of God. We pray for an increase of wise men and women who are attuned to the signs of God drawing them to join together in worship and live together in peace. The ultimate destination of all people is to arrive in the presence of God.
