EXTRAVAGANT LOVE

Forgiveness is a gift. You can’t earn it; it must always be received as a gift. In today’s readings, God’s forgiveness is given to a king, to a nameless woman known throughout the city as a sinner, and to all of us who have been made “right” with God through our faith in the Son of God. There’s just no end to it in sight.

INSIDE THE READINGS

The Gospel passage today contains two distinct accounts. The first is about a woman who washes Jesus’ feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, and then anoints them with oil while Jesus is eating at the home of Simon, a Pharisee (Luke 7:36–50). The woman has a reputation for being a sinner, and so Simon doubts that Jesus can be a prophet or he would have known “what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner” (7:39).

Jesus tells Simon a parable about a creditor who forgives two debtors who owed, respectively, five hundred and fifty days’ wages. In response to Jesus’ question as to who will love the creditor more, Simon correctly responds that it is the one who owed him more. From this, Jesus draws the conclusion that this woman must have had her sins forgiven because she has done the courteous acts of washing, drying, and anointing Jesus’ feet, acts which Simon had not done (7:40–47).

The second account is a brief note on those who accompanied Jesus. It ends with, and so highlights, many women whom Jesus had healed and who responded generously by providing for Jesus and the apostles out of their resources (8:1–3).

Luke’s message at this point of his Gospel is that all have been forgiven much, although some think that they have only little that needs to be forgiven (7:47). The idea of forgiveness as debt removal is a way of helping people to see how forgiveness takes them out of a deep hole in which they find themselves because of their former actions. Those who realize how much they have been forgiven and what a great burden this forgiveness has lifted from their shoulders will respond with a greater love.

THOUGHTS FOR ACTION

Sometimes we need to pray to God for forgiveness for ourselves, at other times that we can forgive others. Not to forgive can be a great burden, doing more harm to the one who won’t—or can’t—forgive than to the one who did the harm. So maybe we should pray, “Forgive us our sins and help us forgive those who sin against us.”
