SICK AND HOMEBOUND: Please notify the Rectory if anyone in your home is seriously sick or homebound.

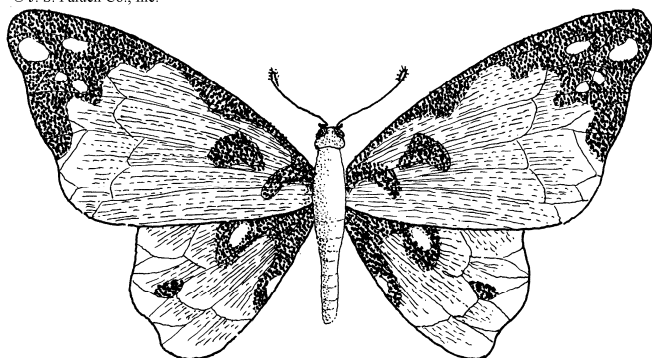
PARISH REGISTRATION: All families or individuals who have moved into the parish should register by filling out the registration card available at the church doors.

PARISH NEWS

FAST AND ABSTINENCE: Catholics over the age of 14 years are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday during Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required by Church law to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is permitted to persons in this age group on those two days, plus two lighter meals. In the case of children under the age of 14, the Church recommends that parents encourage them to perform some kind of voluntary penance suitable for their age.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS AND BENEDICTION will be held on the Fridays of Lent at 8 p.m. All families and parishioners are invited to participate in this longtime Lenten devotion.

I WAS HUNGRY, LOAVES AND FISHES: This Lenten collection is a program to feed the hungry in our Diocese. Your spirit has been generous in the past and much appreciated by those who benefit from it. The envelopes marked "I WAS HUNGRY" are included in your set of monthly envelopes. They are also available at the Church doors.

WHAT DOES A NEW CREATION LOOK LIKE?

The movement of Lent is a journey to Easter, when we will renew our baptismal promises and pledge once more to live a life that renounces the power and attraction of evil and com-mit ourselves more fully to living in union with the Trinity. Today's readings offer us some images of what it means to be a new creation.

INSIDE THE READINGS

In today's second reading Paul explains what it is to be a new creation in Christ, how that has occurred, and how it continues. We are reconciled to God in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:18). Reconciliation means that God did not make our sins an obstacle to reunification (5:19). God's intent to reconcile humanity is so great that this mission has been extended through the ministry of Paul and his coworkers (5:18). So much does God wish to be united with us that God "appeals" to us through Paul, who mirrors this divine desire by "imploping" people to act in ways that make this reconciliation possible (5:20). When such reconciliation occurs, we become a new creation. In other words, new life is given through a new association. Because this association is with God, this new life is God's life. This is why Paul says that those who are reconciled "become the righteousness of God" in Christ (5:21). The new creation, then, is a change from the type of life that a person has led, a shift from alienation from God to union with God. The union occurs through our becoming "the righteousness of God." The word dikaiosune, which our Bible translates as "righteousness," also means "justice." This characteristic was considered in both the Jewish and Greek cultures to be the key virtue. Paul claims that the new creation makes people not only have this essence of humanity in them, but also reconfigured into "the righteousness of God." This perspective energizes us for the task of remaining reconciled to God by adhering to the message. Paul implores the Corinthians to "be reconciled to God" (5:20b). The gift of being a new creation is one that must be accepted continually through personal effort to be open to God's gift.

THOUGHTS FOR ACTION

The path to being a new creation can take forty years, forty days, forty minutes, or forty seconds. Sometime it involves an outer journey; it is always an inner one. We pray that what-ever form our journey takes, we will persevere in becoming, individually and communally, a new creation. We ask the Father to send forth the Holy Spirit upon us so that we will be recreated as this same Spirit continues to renew the face of the earth.
