IN THE BEGINNING, DARKNESS

New life often begins in the dark—the darkness of the earth where seed has been planted, the darkness of the bed-room where the love of a husband and wife brings life to the world, the darkness of the mind where a quest to seek the truth begins. Today we remember that morning when new life began in the darkness of a tomb.

INSIDE THE READINGS

Today's Gospel passage is John's account of the empty tomb experienced first by Mary of Magdala and then by the Beloved Disciple and Simon Peter. The unique features of this version of the Easter story encourage us to wonder what makes the Beloved Disciple beloved and how we are all called to be beloved disciples.

The Beloved Disciple is not so called in this passage, but rather he is called "the other disciple," as he is in John 18:15–16.

Upon hearing the message about the empty tomb from Mary of Magdala, both he and Simon Peter run to see it (John 20:1–3). The Beloved Disciple outruns Peter but waits and allows Peter to enter the tomb first. But it is only the Beloved Disciple who at this time is said to believe (20:8). This is all the more striking because right after this we read, "For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead" (20:9).

In this passage the Beloved Disciple appears to represent belief based on personal experience. After he sees the cloths in which the body of Jesus had been wrapped lying on the ground, he believes (20:6–8). His readiness to believe suggests a person whose faith arises out of reflection on the significance of his experiences. Jesus had previously told bystanders to take the cloths off the body of Lazarus when he raised him (11:44). Similar ideas and words in each passage suggest that the Beloved Disciple has learned from the Lazarus experience the power of God to effect resurrection.

Mature faith must remain rooted in the experience of God in our lives. Being able to observe and reflect on these experiences opens us to new types of experiences of God.

THOUGHTS FOR ACTION

Not all darkness is to be feared. Sometimes it may even be necessary, summoning God to create once again, dispelling the shadow of death and despair that can settle over the human heart. We pray to God on Easter "for the life that shall never again see darkness," asking God to "breathe on our minds and open our eyes that we may know him in the breaking of bread and follow him in his risen life" (Alternative Opening Prayer for Easter Sunday).
