**SICK AND HOMEBOUND:** Please notify the Rectory if anyone in your home is seriously sick or homebound.

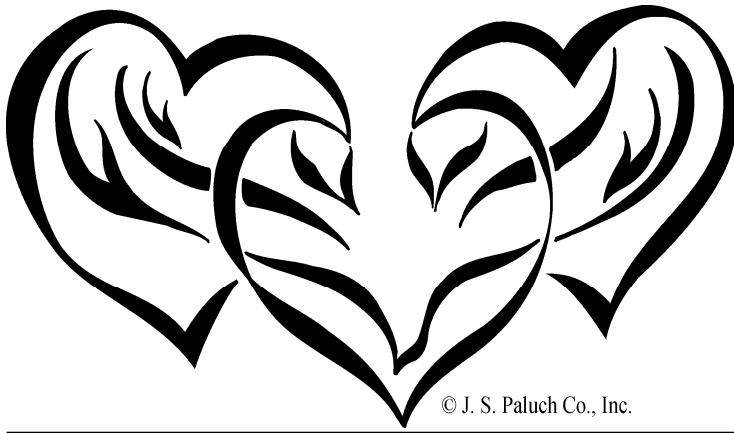
**PARISH REGISTRATION:** All families or individuals who have moved into the parish should register by filling out the registration card available at the church doors.

## WONDERFUL TRIUNE GOD, GIVER OF LIFE

*Often the Trinity becomes an intellectual puzzle that we try to figure out, rather than an invitation to live into the very being of God, the God who is Fullness-of-Being. The God revealed to us in scripture is always reaching out to draw us into relationship—through creating us, redeeming us, and making us holy.*

### INSIDE THE READINGS

The reading from the Letter to the Romans that we hear today is about how the life of the Trinity leads to peace for people in all situations. Christ showed his love for us by dying for us while we were still sinners. It wasn't because we were living sterling moral lives that Christ gave himself for us. So there is something about our very beings that God loves greatly (Romans 5:6–8). Our reading says that this divine love "has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (5:5). For Paul this means that our hope is well founded. Everything in life is a means to good. As Paul says, affliction leads to endurance, endurance to proven character, and proven character to hope. Paul concludes that this hope is secure because of the divine love "poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit." Later on in this letter Paul will describe the effects of the Spirit in us as enabling us to live a godly life (8:2, 4–5, 10–13). Thus, Paul is saying today that all situations lead to a proven character because God has enabled us through the Spirit to live a godly life.

This leads to a deep peace, according to Paul. We have been given the divine life that keeps us close to God. Because of this there need be no fear that any situation can separate us from God. The love of God is stronger than anything else, and its power in us enables us to keep living good lives no matter what. This grace leads to a very specific hope "of the glory of God" (Romans 5:2).

For Paul God's actions through Christ and the sending of the Spirit to us have enabled all situations in life to lead to the glory of God. The fickleness of chance is replaced by the security of divine love.

Praise God, all creatures here below;  
Praise God above, you heavenly host;  
Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
